

Incident Involving an Omni Taxi Aereo Aircraft Near Cabo Frio, Brazil

Update Tuesday, February 11, 3:00 p.m. BRT

Statement following the release of the preliminary investigation report on the Airbus H160 water landing

Omni acknowledges the publication, on February 5, 2026, of the preliminary report issued by CENIPA regarding the water landing involving one of the company's Airbus H160 helicopters, which occurred on January 2, 2026.

We are grateful that everyone on board was brought back safely and, once again, we recognize the pilots' professionalism and the exceptional support provided by emergency and rescue services. The company continues to cooperate fully with the investigation. In line with our commitment to the highest standards of safety and transparency, we have proactively provided all information requested and kept customers and other stakeholders updated, always based on data confirmed by the authorities.

The initial report identifies factors that may have contributed to the event, including procedural and human aspects associated with maintenance performed on the aircraft. As this is a preliminary report, the investigation remains ongoing, with no final conclusions at this time. Omni continues to support CENIPA in the analyses currently under way.

We will continue working in close partnership with the competent authorities and our industry partners to ensure that all identified lessons are fully incorporated.

Safety remains Omni's top priority, and we reaffirm our commitment to the highest standards of airworthiness and operational discipline.

Update Saturday, January 3, 10:00 a.m. BRT

Omni confirms that all six passengers and two crew members involved in yesterday's water landing of an Airbus H-160 helicopter have been discharged from hospital after precautionary medical evaluations and are all in good health.

Omni extends its sincere thanks to the Brazilian Navy for its swift and professional support in the search and rescue operation, as well as to all parties involved in the successful operation.

With everyone safely released, the situation is now fully under control. Omni will continue to cooperate with the competent authorities as part of standard follow-up procedures.

Update Friday, January 2, 5:00 p.m. BRT

Omni Táxi Aéreo confirms that one of its aircraft (Airbus H-160), which departed from Cabo Frio Airport, carried out a water landing today at approximately 11:00 a.m. local time on January 2. All occupants evacuated the aircraft using the onboard lifesaving equipment and, following the immediate activation of emergency response teams and the competent authorities, the company confirms that everyone was successfully rescued and is safe. No injuries were reported.

At this time, passengers and crew are undergoing routine precautionary medical evaluations and are expected to be released soon.

The safety and well-being of everyone on board remain our highest priority. Omni continues to provide full support to those involved and is coordinating closely with the authorities so that the circumstances of the occurrence can be established.

Update Friday, January 2, 2:40 p.m. BRT

Omni Táxi Aéreo confirms that one of its aircraft, which departed from Cabo Frio Airport, carried out a water landing at approximately 11:00 a.m. local time today (the 2nd). All eight occupants evacuated the aircraft and used the onboard inflatable life raft.

Emergency teams and the competent authorities were immediately notified, and the rescue procedure was initiated. The safety and well-being of everyone on board are our highest priority.

We are providing support to the occupants and coordinating actions closely with the authorities so that the circumstances of the occurrence can be established.
